Women's Immersion Camp



Come to the ranch and immerse yourself in the horsemanship experience. This camp is not only about building confidence as a leader and

partner, but it is also designed to aide the horse and rider in developing trust. Participants will have the opportunity to take on new challenges as a group and individually, and to then practice skills learned in a variety of settings. You AND your horse will develop new abilities. You will grow closer to your horse and quite possibly experience a new level of self-awareness during this camp.



ATH Center Facilities include an indoor arena, outdoor arena, wood sided roundpen with grand stand seating, open pasture, riding trail, warm water wash bays, and 12 x 12 box stalls for your horse are available at the ranch.

What You Will Need To Bring

- Current coggins
- Your horse
- Rope halter with 12-foot lead, preferable a 22 foot also, if you have one.
- Saddle, pad and headstall
- Feed and hay
- Your own grooming equipment and supplies.
- Hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, and raingear.
- An open mind & learning attitude.
- Plenty of energy.

Participation is limited to six horse & riders. \$100 deposit is required to reserve your position in camp.

Day 1

- 8:00-9:00.....Arrival at the Ranch
- 9:00-10:00.....Registration – Check in
- 10:00-12:00..... Arena (Control and position assessment)
- 12:00-1:30..... Lunch/ Free Time
- 1:30- 3:30..... Round Pen (Learning importance of "Drive" and "Draw")
- 3:30-5:00..... Round Pen, Learn to use "Drive" to get your horse "Hooked-on"
- 5:00 Tend to the horses and unwind for the evening

Day 2

- 7:00-8:00..... Feed (horses & people!)
- 8:00-8:30..... Review Discussion
- 8:30-9:30..... Round Pen (Saddling: fit, placement, and technique)
- 9:30-12:00..... Round Pen (independent seat)
- 12:00-1:30.....Lunch and Free Time
- 1:30-2:00..... Outdoor arena (Emergency stop)
- 2:00-3:30.....Trail ride on the ranch (Is your horse with you?)
- 3:30-5:00.....Obtaining the correct lead
- 5:00..... Tend to the horses and unwind for the evening

Day 3

- 7:00-8:00.....Feed & Breakfast
- 8:00-8:30..... Review Discussion
- 8:30-10:00..... Arena ("Sending" horse over an obstacle)
- 10:00-12:00.....Outdoor Arena (Trailer loading)
- 12:00-1:30.....Lunch/Free Time
- 1:30-3:00.....Trail Ride (Confidence Building)
- 3:00-5:00.....Outdoor arena (Intro to cow working)
- 5:00..... Tend to the horses and unwind for the evening

Day 4

- 7:00- 8:00.....Feed & Breakfast
- 8:00-8:30..... Discussion
- 8:30-10:00..... Trail obstacle course
- 10:00-11:30..... Arena (Control and position assessment)
- 11:30-12:30..... Lunch
- 12:30-3:30..... Trail ride
- 3:30-5:00..... Final reflections, Achievement certificates, and goodbyes

Accommodations are available at the ATH Center Bunk House. The Bunk House sleeps six and includes bathroom, shower and living room. Rates are \$125 per night and is divided between lodging participants. Trailer hook-ups are also available for \$10 per night. Limited, please reserve in advance.

Cost of 4 day camp is \$600 and includes stall for 1 horse, 8 hours of instruction daily, and optional cattle work. All meals are included.
